

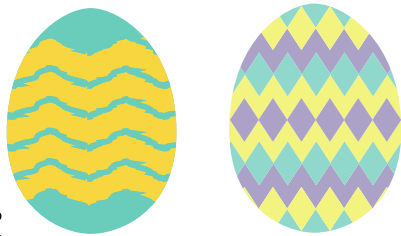


EASTER EGG SUNCATCHERS

Lesson of the Day:

At Easter, there's a tradition of hiding colorful eggs for children to find. Have you ever done an Easter egg hunt? It's pretty fun.

But in real life, there's no need to hide all your wonderful colors. Show off all your beauty in the sunlight! And celebrate other people who do the same.



Materials:

- Tissue paper in various shades
- Contact paper
- Scissors



Instructions:

1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
2. Give each student a large square of contact paper. Put a large pile of small tissue paper squares in the middle of each table.
3. Have students put the tissue paper onto the contact paper and cover the whole thing.
4. Help students place another piece of large contact paper over the top to cover all the tissue paper and keep it all flat.
5. Either have students cut out eggs from that or cut them out yourself. They can either do one large egg or several small ones.
