



FRUIT PLATES

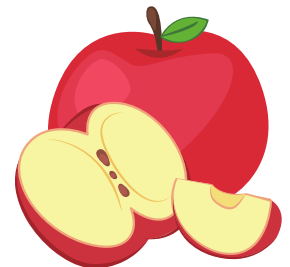
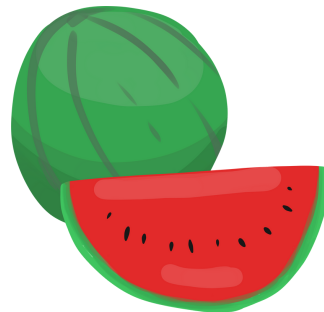
Lesson of the Day:

Most fruits look different on the inside than they do on the outside. Kiwi, for example, are brown and fuzzy, but inside they are sweet and green. People are the same- the way we look on the outside doesn't always match who we are on the inside. So don't judge people based on what they look like! Get to know someone for who they are on the inside and maybe you'll make a new friend.



Materials:

- Paper plates
- Pencils
- Markers
- Scissors
- Rulers



Instructions:

1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
2. Have students brainstorm various fruit slices that they could color on a plate.
3. Encourage them to trace it with pencil first and make a plan of how they want to proceed.
4. Once they've traced their fruit slice with pencil, they can start to color it in.
