

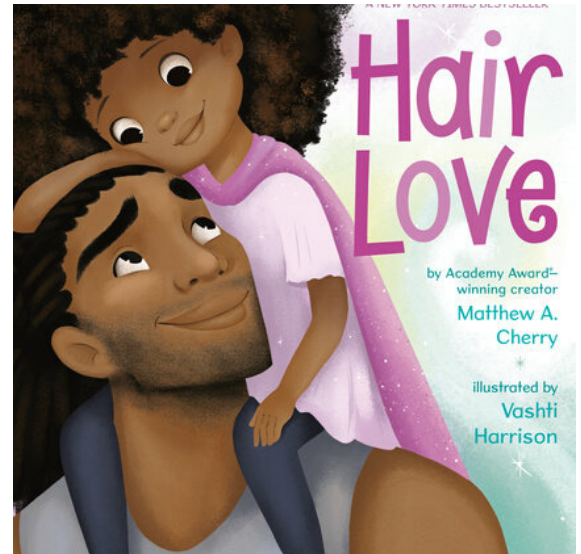


# HAIR LOVE

## Questions:

4. When someone tries to help you but they aren't doing things exactly right, how should you handle it? Should you be kind and gentle? Should you say thank you even though it wasn't perfect? Can you make sure that asking them to do it again is done nicely? "Thank you! But it's not exactly what I wanted. Can we try..."
5. How do you think both she and her dad feel when her hair keeps being right? Are they frustrated? Annoyed? Angry? Do you think hugging someone when you both don't feel good can help?
6. Have you ever watched a video online to learn how to do something you didn't know how to do? Was it helpful?
7. Do dads do hair for their daughters, or is that a mom's job? Is that always true? What happens for people who don't have moms? Or people whose dad is a hairdresser? Is the dad in the story trying his best? What is more important-being normal and seeming perfect, or doing your best and being you?
8. If you stick with something for long enough, will you eventually get it right? If you give up right away, will you ever get it right? That's easy to say, but is it easy to stick with something and keep going even if you keep getting it wrong? So if you see someone who is trying hard but keeps making mistakes, should you laugh or encourage them?
9. It seems like her mom has been gone a while. How would you feel seeing your mom again after a long time apart? How do you think mom felt? Dad?
