

HANDPRINT CHRISTMAS TREE

Lesson of the Day:

Everyone celebrates different things in different ways. Some people celebrate Christmas, and some don't. One isn't right and the other isn't wrong- it's just different. Even if everyone celebrates Christmas, they don't all decorate their tree the same way. Some have plastic trees, some get real trees, and some don't have trees at all! Glitter

Instructions:

- 1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
- 2. Have students paint their hands green and make the tree shape by putting four handprints in a row with three on top of them, two on top of that, and one on the very top if there is space.
- 3. Instruct students to add a trunk to the bottom of the tree and a star to the top.
- 4. Have them fingerpaint ornaments onto the tree.
- 5. After the paint has dried, let the students use glitter glue to add more decorations, like garland or details ornaments.
- 6. They can even add glitter to the star at the top!
