

HANDPRINT LEPRECHAUNS

Lesson of the Day:

Leprechauns are small and they talk differently than we do. They may seem a little funny to you, but if they were real, they would have feelings too. We have to be kind to everyone, even if they look or sound different. Everyone deserves to be happy!

Materials:

- Paint
- Paper
- Gold alitter alue
- Markers





Instructions:

- 1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
- 2. Have students put a red painted handprint on a white piece of paper. The fingertips should be at the bottom of the page. They should leave space at the top for a hat.
- 3. Once the handprint has dried, have them paint skin color in the middle of the palm for the face. They can also paint a green hat on top of the palm.
- 4. Once the paint from that has dried, have them paint a black ribbon around the base of the top hat and the face onto the face in the palm.
- 5. Let them use gold glitter glue to put a buckle on the hat.
