MOSAIC PAPER PLATE TURTLE

Lesson of the Day:

Turtles may wear protection, but underneath there is still a vulnerable creature. Just because someone puts up walls doesn't mean they aren't still human underneath and doesn't mean they can't be hurt. Be kind to everyone.





Materials:

- Tissue paper
- Paper plate
- Glue

- Scissors
- Googly eyes
- Construction paper

Instructions:

- 1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
- 2. Have students glue tissue paper squares to the back of a paper plate. The tissue can overlap, but it should cover the entire back of the plate.
- 3. While that starts to dry, have students cut out and color the arms, legs, tail, and face. Have them glue on googly eyes and draw a face.
- 4. Have students cut any extra tissue paper hanging over the edge of the plate and glue the arms, legs, tail, and head to the plate.
