

ONE FISH TWO FISH

Lesson of the Day:

There are many fish in the sea! There are big ones, tiny ones, fat ones, thin ones, and they all come in a million colors. Just because they are different doesn't mean they hate each other.

They all share the ocean together. We have to do the same- we have to be kind to one another and work together, even if we're different.

Materials:

- White paper
- Crayons

Instructions:

1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.

- 2. Have students trace their hands four times on a piece of paper. Have them color one yellow, one green, one red, and one blue. Have them draw faces on the bottom of the palm with black crayon.
- 3. Have students cut out the handprint fish.
- 4. Have students glue the handprint fish to a piece of white paper or light blue paper. If white, have them color the background of the paper blue to represent the water. Have them draw bubbles. They can color the insides white.
- 5. Have students copy down "One Fish" "Two Fish" "Red Fish" and "Blue Fish" onto the paper from the board.
