


PANCHO RABBIT AND THE COYOTE DUNCAN TONATIUH

Questions:

- 3. When you're happy and excited to see someone, how can you show them? How will they feel when you do those things?
- 4. How does it feel when you are looking forward to something and it doesn't happen? How do you think the Rabbit family felt?
- 5. How do you think Pancho Rabbit's mother will feel when she wakes up and he is gone?
- 6. Does Coyote have empathy? When Pancho almost falls off the train, look at coyote's face. Does he care about Pancho Rabbit? Is Coyote helping because he cares or just because he wants the food? Does he need the food to get Pancho Rabbit where he is going?
- 7. How do you think Pancho Rabbit feels when he has nothing left? When coyote was going to eat him? When Papa saved him?
- 8. How does everyone feels when Papa and Pancho Rabbit come home? Why will they all go together next time?
