



# PAPER BAG WHALES

## Lesson of the Day:

Whales are very big, which can make them seem scary. But they won't hurt anyone! Don't judge anything or anyone on how it looks- sometimes the biggest kids also have the biggest hearts.



## Materials:

- Paper lunch bags
- Blue markers
- Stuffing (crumpled paper)
- Big googly eyes
- Glue
- Ribbon

## Instructions:

1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
2. Have students paint their paper bags dark blue. Let the bags dry as much as possible.
3. While they dry have the students roll up a piece of dark blue paper. Tape it together. Have them cut the tops down into strips (not all the way down). Students can roll down the paper to look like it's blowing out of the whale's blowhole.
4. Punch a hole in the top of each bag. Allow students to draw a face and attach googly eyes to the bag.
5. Fill the bags with scrap paper, twist the end, and staple it to form a tail.
