PAPER PLATE BEACH BALL

Lesson of the Day:

Did you know that sand comes from broken-down minerals and rocks. Beach balls came to be in 1938 in California.



Materials:

- Colored construction paper
- Paper plate
- White paper

- Glue
- Scissors
- Pencil

Instructions:

- 1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
- 2. Draw a circle in the middle of the plate. Draw 6 lines throughout the plate from the middle of the circle to the end.
- 3. Tear construction paper into small pieces
- 4. Glue pieces of torn construction paper into the plate in the 6 lines that were drawn in Step 2.
- 5. Cut a circle out of the white paper to finish the beach ball off by gluing the smaller white circle to the middle of the paper plate beach ball, where you drew the circle in Step 2.
