



PAPER PLATE SUN AND MOON

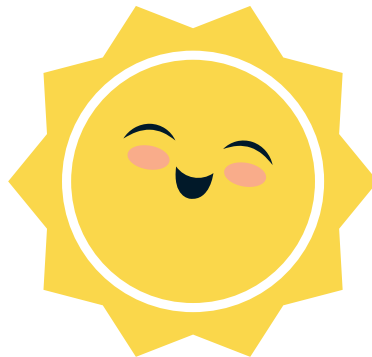
Lesson of the Day:

Sometimes when bad things happen it seems like everything will feel bad forever. But always keep in mind, that even though the night is dark, the sun always rises. Things can turn around. And if you can be the reason that things get better for someone else, do it! It's in our power to bring happiness, beauty, and light to other people's lives.



Materials:

- Two paper plates
- Markers
- Scissors
- Brad



Instructions:

1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
2. Have students draw a line down the middle of the paper plate. On one side, have them draw and color the night sky and on the other, the daytime sky.
3. Have students cut a window in a second paper plate that will show the sky.
4. Help students attach the two paper plates with a brad. Let them turn it and see the day and night skies!
