

## POTTED CACTI

## Lesson of the Day:

Just because someone is prickly on the outside doesn't mean they're a bad person. Sometimes they're just protecting a soft core. In the desert, often there isn't water for miles. But if you cut open a cactus, even a super prickly one, you can find water inside. Often people who are a little tough or mean at first are just trying to protect themself. So be kind!

## **Materials:**

- Pink and green paper
- Scissors
- Green markers



- Glue/glue stick
- Small stick
- Clay
- Small pot



## **Instructions:**

- 1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
- 2. Fill the pot to the top with the clay. Give each student six circles of green paper in their choice of color. Have them fold each in half.
- 3. Have them glue the circles together to make a big fan of circles into the cactus body shape.
- 4. Have them draw cactus lines with a darker green marker than the paper.
- 5. Have students cut tiny spikes from the other green paper and glue them to the cactus edges with glue stick.
- 6. Place the small stick in the clay standing up. Slide the cactus on top.
- 7. Make the flower out of two colorful paper stars overlapping. Place a small ball of yellow clay in the center. Glue it to the top.
