SOAP BUBBLE PICTURES


Lesson of the Day:

Make your mark! Try to decide what kind of mark you want to make on the world and what you want to do to the world around you. Do you want to make it better or make it worse? Make choices that will ensure that the impression you leave on people and the world are exactly the impression you want.

Materials:

- Tempura paint
- Dish soap
- Water
- Bowls

Instructions:



- Paper
- Tape



- 1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
- 2. In a disposable bowl, combine two tablespoons of tempera paint, two tablespoons of dish soap, and 1/4 cup of water. Stir well with a spoon.
- 3. Tape cut out shapes on a sheet of paper.
- 4. Use the straw to blow bubbles that extend past the rim of the bowl. Be careful not to suck in the soap through the straw.
- 5. Scoop the bubbles onto the paper. White or light-colored paper works best. Place the bubbles wherever you want on the paper, and allow them to pop naturally or pop them yourself. When the bubbles pop, they will leave a unique pattern.
- 6. Repeat this process with additional colors. Layer colors on top of each other for colorful paint effects.
