

SUMMER COOL DOWN FANS

Lesson of the Day:

You have the power to make change! It's too hot? Make a fan and use it to cool yourself and others down. Do you see a problem around you? How can you solve it? If you can't all the way solve it, how can you make it better for yourself and others around you?



Materials:

- Paper (regular or construction)
- Paint or other coloring materials!
- Popsicle sticks
- Scissors
- Glue (hot glue)

Instructions:

- 1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
- 2. Use rainbow popsicle sticks, or have students color in plain ones...
- 3. Use around 5 popsicle sticks per fan. Hot glue them together at the base to create the fan shape.
- 4. Trace a fan shape on students paper.
- 5. Have students paint fruit shapes in the fan shape.
- 6. Once dry, cut out the fan shape and glue to the popsicle sticks.
- 7. Fold! (Regular paper is more likely to fold flat, construction paper may not fold all the way flat.)
