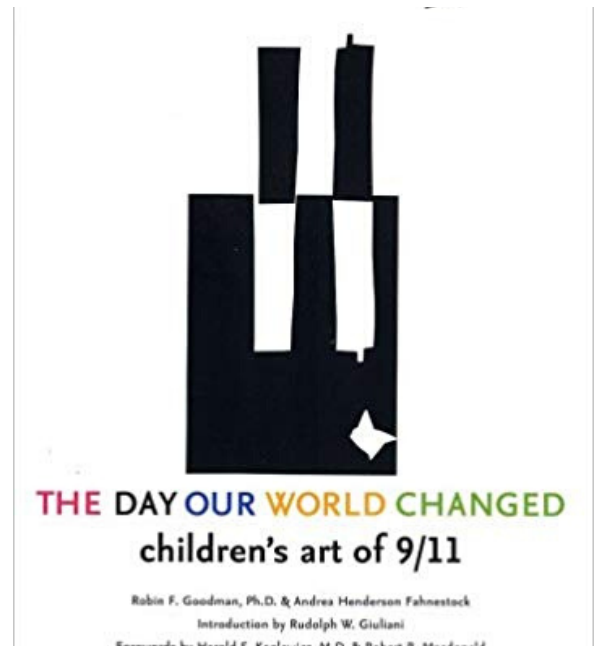




THE DAY OUR WORLD CHANGED

Questions:

1. Look at all the pictures with your students. Talk about what the pictures make them feel. How do they think the artist felt? What emotion does the artwork portray?
2. Read what the children said about September 11. How did people who were young at that time feel? How did people who were adults at that time feel?
3. Talk about your own memory of what happened. All of us who were alive on September 11 remember exactly where we were when we found out what had happened. Read some of the other stories in the books written by adults. This book is to get them to see how individuals felt about this tragedy. Many of these kids did not personally know anyone who was involved, and still they felt for the people affected because they had empathy.
4. The connectedness was what was most important- the way our citizens came together to make something good after the awful thing that happened.
