

TISSUE PAPER POLAR BEAR

Lesson of the Day:

What do you know about polar bears? Polar bears live far away from most other animals. They could go their whole lives without ever seeing another kind of bear, or even one of their own kind. They're lonely animals. When we see someone like that, someone at our school or in our class who doesn't have friends, who plays alone, and who maybe is a little lonely, what do we do? How do we help?



Materials:

- White tissue paper
- Paper plate
- White paper

- Large black puffballs
- Small white cups



Instructions:

- 1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
- 2. Have students cut polar bear ears out of white paper and glue them to the back of the paper plate.
- 3. Have students color two large black eyes toward the top of the plate.
- 4. Have students glue the small white cups upside down as a snout. Each student also glues one large black puffball to the end of the white cup snout.
- 5. Give students tissue paper to glue all over the plate around the eyes and snout.
