



TOILET ROLL FISH

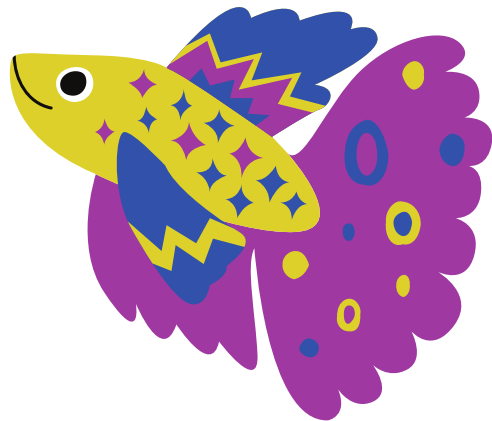
Lesson of the Day:

Do fish swim around by themselves, or do they swim together? They swim together in groups called “schools”. We’re in a school too, and we’re also all together in a group! Groups always work best when people are kind and work together.



Materials:

- Toilet rolls
- Tissue paper, various colors
- Glue
- Scissors
- String
- White paper
- Black markers



Instructions:

1. Discuss the lesson of the day with your students. Talk about what it means to them.
2. Have students cut tissue paper into scale shapes. Have them glue the scales down starting from the bottom.
3. Have students add strips of tissue paper to the bottom as a tail.
4. Have students cut out a white circle and paint a black circle inside for an eyeball. Tape string to the inside of the fish’s “mouth” and hang them around the room as a bright, beautiful decoration!
